Breaking Ground

The City of Marysville proudly marked a significant milestone on December 3, 2024, with a groundbreaking ceremony to welcome Hyatt, Starbucks, and Grocery Outlet to the community. The event, attended by city officials, community leaders, developers, corporate representatives, and residents, celebrated the start of construction on these highly anticipated projects, which are set to enhance Marysville's economy and provide new amenities for locals and visitors alike.

The addition of a Hyatt Hotel promises to boost local tourism, offering modern accommodations and amenities for business travelers and tourists. Starbucks will bring another gathering space for coffee lovers, providing a convenient and inviting atmosphere for residents and commuters. The Grocery Outlet, known for its affordable and high-quality offerings, will expand grocery options for families in the community, supporting both convenience and savings.

Grocery Outlet and Starbucks are scheduled to open in the fall of 2025, with the Hyatt Studios is scheduled to open in the fall of 2026.

Hotel Marysville

On Saturday, June 15, 2024, Marysville lost a significant piece of its history when the iconic Hotel Marysville was consumed by fire. The devastating blaze left the building unsafe and irreparable, shocking residents who mourned the loss of this historic landmark.

After months of deliberation, the City of Marysville took ownership of the site to ensure public safety. The decision was made to demolish the structure, clearing the way for Highway 20 to reopen in the coming weeks.

The City of Marysville is proud to invite community members, businesses, and organizations to take an active role in maintaining and enhancing our local parks. This initiative aims to foster civic pride, environmental stewardship, and a stronger sense of community.

Adopt - A - Park Program

Adopting a Park in Marysville

In an effort to enhance the quality of our parks, the City of Marysville encourages the community to assist with the beautification and maintenance of our parks by facilitating the enhancement of park/playground amenities and providing general upkeep and repair of equipment, recreation facilities, and trails through an Adopt-A-Park program.

The Adopt-A-Park Program allows groups to assume the responsibility for one or more eligible activities at their adopted park. The benefits of this program include:

- Enhancement of the environment
- Beautification of parks, trails, and green spaces
- Greater public education and awareness of parks, recreation, and community services
- Community and/or corporate support of park-related capital improvements

Who can Adopt-A-Park?

Businesses based or operating in the City of Marysville, non-profit groups, families, schools, government entities, or faith-based groups, whose goals and activities shall reflect the City of Marysville's Core Values and Goals, are eligible to participate in the Adopt-A-Park program. The organization must be free from discrimination based on race, color, creed, nationality, sex, marital status, disability, religion, or political affiliation. Parties currently involved in a lawsuit whose position is adverse to the City, and organizations that create a conflict of interest for the City will not be eligible to participate in the Adopt-A-Park program.
